- 4. SCHS and SEDC will coordinate a discussion with the County Commissioners concerning the 307 E. Oak lease, as appropriate, after January 1, 2023.
- 5. In all other respects, the MOU of November 9, 2009 is hereby ratified and confirmed.

- 2. Consideration. The consideration shall be the sum of \$1.00 per year, payable at one time, paid in advance, hereof or any extension hereof, with the such payment being due and payable upon the execution hereof.
- 3. Condition of Building. The premises are leased and demised unto Lessee in their "as is" condition and Lessor makes no warranty, express or implied, with respect to the condition of the leased premises.
- 4. Use of Premises. Lessee shall use the leased premises solely for an office and archive storage, and for no other purpose.
 - 5. Conditions. Lessee covenants and agrees as follows:
 - (a) During the term of this lease, Lessee will commit no waste upon the premises, and will return the premises to Lessor at the termination of this lease in as good a condition as when received, reasonable wear and tear and damages covered under the standard windstorm, fire and extended coverage insurance policy issuable in Texas, excepted. It is further understood and agreed that Lessee shall make all reasonable repairs and maintenance upon the improvements located on said premises, including, but not limited to interior walls, ceilings, floors and floor coverings, all glass windows, interior electrical, plumbing, lights, light fixtures and all other interior elements of the leased premises: Lessor shall have no obligation to repair or maintain the premises.
 - (b) Inspection. Lessor shall, at all reasonable times and upon reasonable notice to Lessee, have the right to enter on the property for the purpose of inspecting the same.
 - (c) The property is and shall at all times, be and remain the sole and exclusive property of Lessor. Lessee shall have no right, title or interest therein except as expressly set forth in this lease.

- (d) Lessee agrees to promptly comply with all laws, rules and orders of Federal, State and Municipal Governments and all of their Departments applicable to the premises herein leased. Lessee will conduct his business in such a manner as not to create any nuisance.
- (e) Lessor will keep the improvements and equipment insured for windstorm, fire and extended coverage, and will pay all ad valorem and other taxes assessed against the premises. Lessee hereby agrees pay all taxes and insurance on the contents of the building and to purchase and keep in force a minimum of one million dollars of liability insurance and all bonds required by any state or federal laws pertaining to the business to be operated therein. Lessee further agrees to furnish Lessor copies of such insurance and bonds.
- (f) <u>Indemnity</u>. Lessee shall indemnify Lessor against and shall hold Lessor harmless from any and all claims, actions proceedings, suits, expenses, damages and liabilities, including attorney's fees arising out of, connected with or resulting from the Lessee's use of the property. Lessee hereby waives any and every claim which arises or may arise in Lessee's favor against Lessor during the term of this lease, for any and all loss of, or damages to, any of its property located within or upon or constituting a part of the Leased Premises whether or not such loss or damage is attributable to the acts, negligence or omissions of the Lessor.
- (g) No right or remedy herein conferred or reserved to Lessor is exclusive of any other right or remedy herein or by law or equity provided or permitted; but, each shall be cumulative of every other right or remedy given hereunder or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute or otherwise and may be enforced concurrently therewith or from time to time.
- 6. Waiver. No covenant or condition of this lease may be waived except by written consent of Lessor. Forbearance or indulgence by Lessor in any regard whatsoever shall not constitute a waiver of this covenant or condition to be performed by Lessee, to which same may apply, and, until complete performance by Lessee of any covenant or condition herein, Lessor shall be entitled to invoke any remedy available to Lessor under this lease or by law or in equity, despite said forbearance or indulgence.
- 7. <u>Payments</u>. Lessee agrees to pay, as the same become due, and before the same shall become delinquent, all charges for the use of utilities, sewer, telephone, water and other charges incurred in connection with Lessee's use of the property.
- 8. <u>Notice</u>. Service of all notices under this lease shall be sufficient if given personally or mailed to the party involved at the respective address hereinafter set forth, or at such address as said party may provide in writing from time to time. Any such notice mailed to such address shall be effected when deposited in the United States mail, duly addressed, and with postage prepaid.

- 12. <u>Lease Binding</u>. This lease shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns, where permitted by this lease.
- 13. <u>Invalidity</u>. If any one or more of the provisions contained in this lease shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this lease shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

Memorandum of Understanding

This agreement between Sonora Economic Development Corporation (Tenant) and Sutton County Historical Society (Owner) is to document certain points of agreement regarding the occupancy of the office building at 307 East Oak Street, Sonora, TX. Points of this agreement will be honored on a month-to-month basis with annual review and amendments as agreed by both parties. Termination of this agreement may be affected by either party upon 90-days written notice.

The Space:

Tenant will occupy approximately 60% of said building in space consisting of the back office and main office and meeting area in the front of the building with access to the common areas of restroom, copy area and kitchen. Owner will occupy the remainder of the building.

Rent:

In lieu of rental payments, Tenant will provide administrative services to the Owner. Such services will consist of greeting and directing visitors, answering telephone and managing messages and reservations, opening and monitoring other Owner facilities at the location, and such other coordinating services as might be required. Tenant expects these services to require approximately one (1) hour per working day on average. Tenant will document the provision of services and will bill Owner for services rendered in excess of 20 hours per month. The rate to be used to calculate services in lieu of rent and any service charges will be the regular hourly rate of the SEDC Office Manager plus employee benefits and taxes. That amount for Fiscal Year 2009-2010 is \$19.50 per hour (subject to annual adjustment, as appropriate).

Utilities:

Based on approximate space occupied, Tenant will pay 60% of the actual cost of utilities and janitorial services, not to exceed the following annual limits (based on current expenditures):

Electricity = \$3,690
 Water, Sewer, Garbage = \$1,015
 Internet = \$900
 Janitorial services = \$575

These annual limits are subject to an annual escalator based on actual rate of inflation starting 10/1/2010.

Tenant will pay for its own telephone service and equipment.

Repairs and Maintenance:

Tenant will share in the cost of routine repairs and maintenance to facilities and appliances that are consumed or utilized in the everyday operation of the office. Repairs or installations that involve the structural integrity or functional utilities of the building will be for Owner's account. Based on approximate space occupied, Tenant will pay 60% of the cost of routine repair and maintenance. (Examples: (1) repair of

stopped-up toilet would be for the joint repair account; repair or replacement of the toilet fixture would be for the Owner's account; (2) routine servicing of AC/H unit would be for the joint repair account; replacement of entire unit due to catastrophic failure would be for Owners account.)

Insurance:

Tenant will provide insurance for own office contents and premises liability.

Security:

Keys to the office building will be restricted to designated users as agreed to by Owner and Tenant. Usage of the office facilities by anyone other than designated users will be authorized by a designated user and documented.

Meeting Facility:

To satisfy legal requirements, a room in the Depot will be provided for the holding of public meetings by Tenant and Owner. This meeting facility may also be leased by Owner to third parties without conflict with Tenant's needs. Tenant agrees to provide board room furnishings (tables and chairs) on a loan basis in return for use privilege of the meeting facility.

Signage:

Tenant will participate in the design of signage to identify the occupants of the office and pay 40% of the cost of constructing and installing the agreed upon signage.

Management:

This arrangement will be managed by an Executive Committee consisting of the elected Presidents of the Sonora Economic Development Corporation and the Sutton County Historical Society. Any matters that cannot be resolved by the Executive Committee will be addressed by the Boards of Directors of the two organizations.
