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### Dry Devils River Ranch - Subdivision Variance Request May 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023

Dear County Judge Harris & Commissioners Bloodworth, Brockman, Teaff & Martinez,

On behalf of HSW Land LLC, the developer of the proposed Dry Devils River Ranch Subdivision, I hereby request a variance from the Sutton County Subdivision regulations regarding the following items:

### 1. Road Construction Standards. Section G on pages 18-20:

- a. HSW Land LLC requests Sutton County waive the road construction requirements listed on pages 18-20. These existing roads are caliche & crushed limestone material roads that have been utilized by the previous owners and oilfield for the past 25 plus years. HSW Land has also reworked each of these roads in the past 45 days including adding material, watering, blading and rolling. Every road within the subdivision will have a 60' dedicated ROW for utilities and tract owners are not allowed to block those roadways with gates. The tract buyers will be bound by a Road Maintenance Agreement with an annual fee to create a fund for road maintenance as needed and decided on by the tract buyers. HSW Land LLC requests Sutton County approve the current roads as is and welcomes the Judge & Commissioners to tour the ranch to inspect the roads.
- b. The disclaimer language in Section J on Page 23 will be stated on the plat, reiterated in the Road Maintenance Agreement buyers must sign when purchasing, as well as the Deed Rest ictions that will be recorded with the County Clerk and must be acknowledged by all buyers when purchasing. In summary, any buyer will have to sign acknowledging this on 3 separate documents.

### 2. Water Availability Study. Section H on page 21:

a. HSW Land requests Sutton County waive the water availability study requirements listed on page 21 due to Sutton County not requiring this in the recent past with near identical subdivisions. Section H also states that the County "has the authority to require" but does not specifically state the County must require compliance with water availability requirements. These tracts average around 100 acres each and the ranch is surrounded by large acreage neighbors. There are 13 existing water wells on the property, with 2 of them being over 200 GPM wells. A water availability study for a development this size could cost around \$300,000 and take up to 6 months to complete. The normal intent of a water study at the depths of which state law requires is for subdivisions where the tracts are much smaller; typically under 10 acres. There is a section stating test wells should be spaced no more that 300 feet apart which means that almost any test wells we drill wou d be an extra well on a lot that would not be needed by the lot buyer. The SCUWCD has already expressed to me they would like to minimize the number of new water wells but these tests would go against that request.

- b. All of the disclaimer language stated on Section J on Page 23 will be included on both the plat and recorded deed restrictions, both of which any lot buyer is required to sign acknowledging. This expressly indemn fies Sutton County.
- c. This additional note from page 17 clearly indemnifies both Sutton County and the SCUWCD and will be included on the plat and the deed restrictions; "SUTTON COUNTY AND THE SUTTON COUNTY UNDERGROUND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT MAKE NO REPESENTATION OR GUARANTEE AS TO WATER QUALITY OR THAT A PRESENT OR FUTURE ADEQUATE WATER SUPPLY EXISTS."
- d. HSW Land takes no issue with items number 3 and 4 on page 21 in Section H which state that the SCUWCD rules as well as their Drought Contingency Plans applies to any subdivision. Furthermore, in an effort to be proactive for groundwater management, at the request of the SCUWCD, we will impose a maximum size of 1 acre for any new stock ponds should a lot buyer decide to build one.
- e. \*\*Added from initial variance request\*\* HSW Land agrees to provide a successful water well for residential/agricultural use for the tract buyer before selling any tract. If a buyer buys more than 1 tract, only 1 water will be required in the spirit of minimizing the amount of new water wells drilled to minimize water consumption.

### 3. Bond Requirements. Section I on page 22:

- a. HSW Land LLC requests Sutton County waive the bond requirements due to the fact the road improvements have already beer built and HSW Land LLC is not requesting any maintenance of any roads with n the subdivision by Sutton County. All roads will be maintained by a Road Maintenance Agreement that each tract owner is bound by with annual dues. Along with this Road Maintenance agreement, these roads are also maintained by UPP and Rover cil & gas operators. No County roads are utilized to get to this proposed subdivision as well; access is straight off of HWY 277. It is my understanding that Construction Bonds are typically required before roads are built and more so when roads will be built by the developer and then taken over after 1 year by the County for maintenance from then on.
- b. HSW Land LLC is not asking the County to maintain these roads as it knows it would place undue financial burden on the County.

### PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT

Profit Corporation, whose address is 307 East Oak Street	
and Sutton County	, whose address is
300 E. Oak St. Ste 4, Sonora, Sutton	County, Texas.
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### **BACKGROUND**

**Purpose:** SEDC is a tax-supported non-profit corporation, whose primary income is from sales tax collected within the City of Sonora and dedicated exclusively to economic and community development. This sales tax is authorized as a local option under V.A.C.S. Art. 5190.6 and exists for the primary purpose of developing, stabilizing, diversifying, and recruitment of employment opportunities in order to benefit citizens of Sonora and the surrounding areas.

**Project:** The project and performance requirements to be implemented by means of this agreement are described in Schedule A that is attached to this contract. The specific project is:

Sonora Outlaw Rodeo Association has presented the safety concerns and limitations of rodeo events due to old equipment at Sutton County Rodeo Grounds. As a Type B Economic Development Corporation, the board of directors agreed to assist in the funding of the new equipment. The improvements will better serve the business community by increasing sales tax with taxable purchases made, as well as, an increase in HOTs funds due to the overnight stays at hotels for junior rodeo events. The expenditure of \$168,000.00 was approved at the second City Council public hearing on April 17, 2023.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants, warranties and agreements of the parties, it is agreed as follows:

### ECONOMIC BENEFITS AND INCENTIVES AND PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

- A. Money Grant: SEDC will convey by money grant to *Sutton County*, (hereinafter referred to as GRANTEE) a total of up to *One Hundred Sixty-Eight Thousand* dollars (\$168,000.00), subject to the performance requirements and the conditions precedent as set forth in Schedule A.
- B. It is acknowledged that economic benefits accruing to Sonora area taxing jurisdictions under the terms of this contract are the result of the use and enjoyment by tourists and residents utilizing the retail establishment. The specific performance requirements associated with this agreement, as described in SCHEDULE A, are the sole responsibility of the GRANTEE. The GRANTEE agrees to meet and provide copies of all required performance requirements as specified in the attached SCHEDULE A and to remedy any performance-related defaults. Failure by the GRANTEE to timely and fully comply with any performance requirement shall be an Act of Default by the GRANTEE thus giving the SEDC, as its sole remedy, the right to the contracted amount to be conveyed and further being limited to the terms and conditions of this performance contract.

### COVENANTS, WARRANTIES, OBLIGATIONS, AND DUTIES

The GRANTEE makes the following covenants and warranties to SEDC and agrees to timely and fully perform the following obligations and duties. Any false and substantially misleading statement contained herein or failure to timely and fully perform as required in the agreement shall be an act of default by the GRANTEE. Failure to comply with any one covenant or warranty shall constitute an act of default by the GRANTEE.

- 1. Sutton County shall provide proof of good standing is defined in schedule A.
- 2. The execution of this agreement has been duly authorized by the GRANTEE officers and management and the organization's officer signing this agreement is an officer of the organization empowered to execute such agreement and bind the organization.
- 3. No consent, approval or authorization of or registration or declaration within any governmental authority is required in connection with the execution of this agreement or the transactions contemplated hereby.
- 4. No litigation or governmental proceeding is pending or, to the knowledge of GRANTEE or its officers, threatened against or affecting GRANTEE that may result in material adverse change in GRANTEE'S business, properties or operation.

5. GRANTEE does not and will not knowingly employ an undocumented worker. If, after receiving a public subsidy, GRANTEE is convicted of a violation under 8 U.S.C. Section 1324a(f), GRANTEE shall repay the amount of the public subsidy, with interest, not later than the 120<sup>th</sup> day after the date SEDC notifies GRANTEE of the violation.

### III.

### SUSPENSIONS/TERMINATIONS/DAMAGES

- 1. SEDC, at its sole discretion, may suspend its obligation under this Agreement and terminate this Agreement and recapture from the GRANTEE any of the money grants or consideration paid by SEDC without liability to the GRANTEE upon any of the following event:
  - (a) An act of default by GRANTEE
  - (b) The appointment of a receiver of GRANTEE or of all or any substantial part of its property and the failure of such receiver to be discharged within sixty (60) days thereafter;
  - (c) The adjudication of GRANTEE as bankrupt; or
  - (d) The filing by GRANTEE of a petition or an answer seeking bankruptcy, receivership, reorganization or admitting the material allegations of a petition filed against it in any bankruptcy or reorganization proceeding.
- 2. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, SEDC specifically agrees that the GRANTEE shall in no event whatsoever be liable to SEDC for any amount in excess of the actual money grants received by the GRANTEE from SEDC pursuant to the Agreement and shall not be liable to SEDC for any other actual or consequential damages, direct or indirect, interest, attorney fees, or cost of court for any breach of the Agreement or its obligations owing to SEDC.

### IV.

### REPORT AND MONITORING

The GRANTEE acknowledges and agrees that the failure to fully and timely comply with the requirement specified in Exhibit A in any material respect shall constitute an Act of Default. Sutton County further agrees to provide the SEDC with the following information on or before the Expiration Date:

- (a) maintenance schedule on equipment;
- (b) proof of insurance on equipment,
- (c) proof of events held at rodeo arena.

### **SEDC's LIABILITY LIMITATIONS**

The GRANTEE specifically agrees that SEDC shall only be liable to the GRANTEE for the actual amount of the money grants to be conveyed to the GRANTEE and shall not be liable to the GRANTEE for any other actual or consequential damages, direct or indirect, interest, attorney fees, or cost of court for any act of default by the GRANTEE under the terms of this agreement. It is further specifically agreed that SEDC shall only be required to pay the grant amount solely out of its sales tax revenue currently collected, allocated and budgeted and to be allocated, budgeted and collected for SEDC during the term of this agreement. Payment by SEDC is strictly limited to those funds so allocated, budgeted, and collected solely during the grant term of this agreement. Payment to be made to the GRANTEE shall also require a written request from the GRANTEE to be accompanied by all necessary supporting documentation in accordance with Schedule A of this performance contract. SEDC shall have forty-five (45) days to make payment after receipt of such payment request. The payment request should be directed to the SEDC President, 307 East Oak Street, Sonora TX 76950. It is expressly agreed that payment will be made to Sutton County, which is the primary contractor for this project.

### VI.

### APPLICABLE LAWS, VENUE

This agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Sutton County, Texas. Venue for any dispute will be in Sutton County, Texas.

### VII.

### NOTICE OF DEFAULT

SEDC shall give the GRANTEE written notice at the address set forth on the signature page hereto of any Act of Default by the GRANTEE, and the GRANTEE shall have thirty (30) days after receipt of the notice to cure the default. Failure by the GRANTEE to timely and fully cure the Act of Default shall permit the SEDC to pursue all legal remedies provided by law and not specifically prohibited herein.

### VIII.

### **TERM**

Unless extended by mutual agreement, this performance contract shall remain in force for a period of no more than Three (3) years from date of execution.

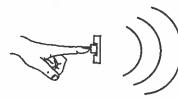


In an emergency, when seconds count, the WAVE Plus system transmits a detailed message specifying the location of the incident over the radios carried by first responders, by email and by text message. There is no faster way to notify law enforcement and staff of an emergency.

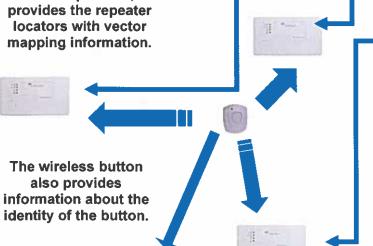

### **Unclaimed Property Capital Credits for Counties**

### Glenn Hegar

Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts

In conjunction with Local Government Code, Section 381.004, Texas Property Code, Section 74.602 authorizes the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts (Comptroller's office) to allocate a portion of the unclaimed capital credits received from electric cooperatives back to the counties in the cooperatives' service area.

### What are unclaimed capital credits?

Electric cooperatives that have lost contact with a previous customer sometimes report capital credits to the Comptroller's office as unclaimed property. Texas law allows counties to claim a portion of unclaimed capital credits originating from their county and use them for specific programs.

### How are funds divided among counties?

- Electric cooperatives report unclaimed capital credits and the county of service from which they originated.
- Electric Cooperatives must use the numeric Federal Information Processing Standard (FIPS) county code of the service address. This code must be entered in the country code field of the remittance report.
- · A county may or may not receive funds in a given year.

### Who qualifies?

- · Any county can request a portion of these funds.
- The county must follow instructions in Local Government Code, Section 381.004 to request funds.
- The commissioners court is the primary governing body and ultimate decision-making authority on the legitimacy of fund requests.

### General uses of capital credits

The county commissioners court may use capital credits to develop and administer a program:\*

- · for state or local economic development
- · for small or disadvantaged business development
- to stimulate, encourage and develop business location and commercial activity in the county
- to promote or advertise the county and its vicinity or conduct a solicitation program to attract conventions, visitors and businesses
- to improve the extent to which women and minority businesses are awarded county contracts
- to support comprehensive literacy programs that benefit county residents
- for the encouragement, promotion, improvement and application of the arts
- · to support a children's advocacy center
- \*Review Local Government Code, Section 381,004 before starting a program

### How to request capital credits

The county judge and/or commissioners court must complete and submit the form on the back of this notice.

- The form must be signed by a representative of the commissioners court or the county judge.
- The form must include the complete name, address and federal tax identification number of the commissioners court. Funds will be paid directly to the court.
