- Transport must be from a pickup location in Sutton County, TX, and
- If the covered individual transported is uninsured at the time of transport, Med-Trans Corporation will bill the covered individual at the "Medicare Allowable Rate" for the transport.

#### Fees:

Sutton County, TX will pay to AirMedCare Network a total of \$19,690.00 annual.

#### **Upgrade Benefit to Covered Individuals:**

Any individual who resides within the boundaries of Sutton County, TX may elect to obtain a full household membership (which eliminates the exceptions listed above) by completing an application and paying the following fees:

"Senior rate is available to the primary and secondary	household member if they are 60 years of age or older.

#### **Duration:**

This agreement will be effective upon AirMedCare Network's receipt of (a) this agreement signed by the participating Organization AND (b) payment of the amount as provided above. This agreement will be effective for one (1) year, and will be evaluated by both parties for renewal at least thirty (30) days prior to the end of the one (1) year term.









#### **Terms and Conditions**

AirMedCare Network ("AMCN") is an altiance of affitiated emergency air ambulance providers" (each a **Provider**). Your AMCN membership automatically enrolls you as a member in each Provider's membership program. Membership ensures that you will have no out-of-pocket flight expenses if flown by a Provider by providing prepaid protection against a Provider's air ambulance costs that are not covered by any insurance, benefits, or third-party responsibility available to you, subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Patient transport will be to the closest appropriate medical facility for medical conditions that are deemed by the AMCN Provider attending medical professionals to be life- or limb-threatening, or that could lead to permanent disability, and which require emergency air ambulance transport. A patient's medical condition, not membership status, will dictate whether or not air transportation is appropriate and required. Under all circumstances, an AMCN Provider retains the sole right and responsibility to determine whether or not a patient is flown. Emergent ground ambulance transport of a member by an AMCN Provider, in connection with an emergent air ambulance transport by a Provider, will be covered under these same terms and conditions.
- 2. AMCN Provider air ambulance services may not be available when requested due to factors beyond the Provider's control, such as use of the appropriate aircraft by another patient or other circumstances governed by operational requirements or restrictions including, but not limited to, equipment manufacturer limitations, governmental regulations, maintenance requirements, patient condition, age or size, or weather conditions. FAA restrictions prohibit most AMCN Provider aircraft from flying in inclement weather conditions. The primary determinant of whether to accept a flight is always the safety of the patient and medical flight crews.
- 3. Members who have any insurance or other benefits available to them, or third party responsibility (or liability) claims, that cover in any way the cost of ambulance services are financially liable for the cost of AMCN Provider services up to the limit of any such available coverage or recovery. In return for payment of the membership fee, the AMCN Provider will consider its air ambulance costs that are not covered by any insurance, benefits or other third-party responsibility available to the member to have been fully prepaid. "Insurance" or "benefits" means any and all types of insurance or benefits without any limitation. By way of example only, such "insurance" or "benefits" include medical benefits available under health insurance, automobile insurance, homeowners insurance, workers compensation, and government insurance or benefits programs. Further, the terms "insurance" or "benefits" include any insurance or benefits that are owned by a member (or that are written or held in a member's name), as well as any insurance or benefits owned by someone else (or that are written or held in someone else's name) that provide coverage, to any extent, for the services provided by the AMCN Provider to a member. "Third-party responsibility" means any amounts that any third-party is required to pay to a member because of or related to the AMCN Provider's services rendered to the member. The AMCN Provider reserves the right to seek payment directly from any available insurance, benefits provider, or third party for services rendered to a member (to the same extent it could do so for any non-member patient), and members authorize all available insurers, benefits providers, and responsible third parties to pay any covered amounts directly to the AMCN Provider.
- 4. Members agree to remit to the AMCN Provider any payment received from any insurance, benefit providers, or any third party for any services provided by the AMCN Provider, not to exceed the amount charged by the AMCN Provider, including (but not limited to) instances in which payment for an AMCN Provider's services is made via settlement with any insurers, benefit providers, or third parties found responsible for a member's injury or condition leading to the air medical services provided by the AMCN Provider. Remitting such payments are not member out-of-pocket expenses because such payments originated from third parties only because of the air medical services provided to the member. Failure by a member to remit such payments constitutes a material breach of these terms and conditions and authorizes the Provider to seek full payment for its services from the member.

### CONTRACT FOR ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION SERVICES

STATE OF TEXAS )(

COUNTY OF SUTTON )(

WHEREAS, Sutton County and the Sutton County Appraisal District have the power and authority with reference to the terms of Section 6.24, Property Tax Code, to authorize the Sutton County Appraisal District as the Tax Assessor-Collector for Sutton County.

NOW, therefore for the consideration hereinafter expressed and the mutual conditions hereof, it is mutually agreed by and between the Taxing Unit and the Appraisal District, as follows:

#### PURPOSE

The parties to this agreement wish to consolidate the assessment and collection of property taxes in one agency, namely the Sutton County Appraisal District.

#### TERM

This contract shall be effective from January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2027.

#### SERVICE TO BE PERFORMED

- The Appraisal District shall collect the ad valorem property taxes owing to the taxing unit that is a party to this contract. The Appraisal District further agrees to perform for the taxing unit all the duties provided by the laws of the State of Texas for collection of said taxes.
- 2. The Appraisal District shall also perform all the functions set out in this contract.
- 3. The Taxing Unit hereby contracts with the Chief Appraiser to serve as its tax assessor for purposes of compliance with Chapter 26 of the Texas Property Tax Code, as amended. In addition, the parties agree that the Chief Appraiser shall perform all duties required by law of the tax assessor-collector in regard to assessing and collecting ad valorem taxes.
- 4. The Appraisal District agrees to prepare and mail all tax statements; provide monthly collection reports to the Taxing Unit; prepare tax certificates; develop and maintain both

- current and delinquent tax rolls; and to develop and maintain such other records and forms as are necessary or required by Law of state rules and regulations.
- 5. The Appraisal District shall make payments of current taxes, delinquent taxes, penalty and interest collected into such depository as selected by the Taxing Unit on a weekly basis or as deemed necessary. The deposits shall be made to the account of the Taxing Unit. A copy of the deposit check shall be made available.

#### CONSIDERATION

- The Taxing Unit agrees to pay for the performance of all services under this contract.
   These costs shall be allocated among the taxing units contracting for assessment and collection services. Each taxing unit shall pay the portion of the cost of assessing and collecting equal to its proportionate share of the total levy.
- 2. The cost shall be estimated by the Chief Appraiser in a budget. Should the amount estimated for assessment and collection prove insufficient, the district may amend budget at that time by utilizing the same procedures normally used to amend the district budget.
- 3. Unless the governing body of a taxing unit and the Chief Appraiser agree to a different method of payment, each taxing unit shall pay its allocation in four equal payments to be made at the end of each calendar quarter, the first payment shall be made before January 1<sup>st</sup> of the year in which the budget takes effect. A payment is delinquent if not paid on the date it is due. A delinquent payment incurs a penalty of 5 percent of the amount of the payment and accrues interest an annual rate of 10 percent.
- 4. The parties agree that any other taxing unit authorized under the provision of the Tax Code to participate in the district, may join in this contract by agreeing to its terms and conditions. Should an additional taxing unit join in this contract, the district shall recalculate the total amount due from each Taxing Unit according to the formula used to calculate the original payment obligations. If any payments have been made to the district prior to the joining of the additional party, the remaining quarterly amounts will be adjusted to reflect the recalculated total payment due.
- 5. The Taxing Unit that request any extra expenses to be incurred by the district will be responsible for the additional costs.

#### **DELINQUENT TAX SUITS**

The Taxing Units authorizes the district to initiate such suits for the collection of delinquents taxes as the district deems necessary and to contract with an attorney as provided by Section 6.30 of the Property Tax Code, for the collection of delinquent taxes.

#### MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

The district shall not be liable to the taxing units on account of any failure to collect taxes nor shall the Chief Appraiser be liable unless the failure to collect taxes results from some on failure her part to perform the duties imposed upon her by law and by this agreement.

#### **DEFINITIONS**

For the purpose of this agreement, the term "assessment" and "collection" shall include the following:

- Calculation of tax
- Preparation of current delinquent tax rolls
- Correction of clerical errors in tax rolls
- Collection of current liabilities
- Collection of delinquent taxes
- Issuance of refunds
- Calculation of the No-New Revenue Tax Rate and Voter Approval Tax Rate

The term "assessment" shall not include those functions defined as "appraisal" by the Property Tax Code.

Neither the Providers nor AMCN will be responsible for payment for services provided by another ambulance service.
- 6. Membership starts 15 days after AMCN receives a complete application with full payment; however, the waiting period will be waived for unforeseen events occurring during such time. Members must be natural persons. Memberships are non-refundable and non-transferable.
- 7. Some state laws prohibit Medicaid beneficiaries from being offered membership or being accepted into membership programs. By applying, members certify to the Providers that they are not Medicaid beneficiaries.
- 8. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. THE LIABILITY OF AMCN AND THE PROVIDERS, AND THE DAMAGES AVAILABLE TO A MEMBER, FOR BREACH OF THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS IS LIMITED TO ACTUAL DAMAGES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED (A) ANY AMOUNT ACTUALLY RECEIVED BY AMCN OR ANY PROVIDER IN VIOLATION OF THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS AND (B) THE MEMBERSHIP FEE PAID BY THE MEMBER FOR THE APPLICABLE MEMBERSHIP TERM. IN NO EVENT SHALL AMCN OR ANY PROVIDER BE LIABLE TO A MEMBER UNDER THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS PURSUANT TO ANY CONTRACT, NEGLIGENCE, STRICT LIABILITY, TORT, OR OTHER LEGAL OR EQUITABLE THEORY FOR ANY INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES OF ANY NATURE WHATSOEVER, ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM OR THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS, EVEN IF AMCN OR A PROVIDER HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. THE MEMBER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT THE LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY SET FORTH IN THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS REFLECT AN ALLOCATION OF RISK SET FORTH IN THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS AND THAT, IN THE ABSENCE OF SUCH LIMITATIONS, THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS WOULD BE SUBSTANTIALLY DIFFERENT.
- 9. Any and all matters arising out of or relating to the AMCN membership program, these terms and conditions, and/or the subject matter hereof shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the United States of America (including without limitation, the Federal Arbitration Act) and, to the extent not preempted by Federal law, the laws of the State of Missouri without regard to conflicts or choice of law principles, regardless of the legal theory upon which such matter is asserted. Outside of these terms and conditions, Federal law preempts state and local laws, regulations, and other provisions, including common law duties that relate to rates, routes, or services of an air carrier. To the extent a state or political subdivision thereof makes the incorporation of common law duties or state law in contracts optional, the Providers and you agree that this contract does not incorporate any such common law duties or state laws.
- 10. ARBITRATION AGREEMENT. Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to the AMCN membership program, these terms and conditions, and/or the subject matter hereof shall be resolved by binding arbitration by a single arbitrator pursuant to the Consumer Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association ("Rules"), as modified by these terms and conditions. The place of arbitration will be St. Louis, Missouri. The judgment on any award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. THERE SHALL BE NO RIGHT OR AUTHORITY FOR ANY CLAIMS TO BE ARBITRATED ON A CLASS ACTION, JOINT OR CONSOLIDATED BASIS OR ON BASES INVOLVING CLAIMS BROUGHT IN A PURPORTED REPRESENTATIVE CAPACITY ON BEHALF OF OTHER MEMBERS OR OTHER PERSONS. THE ARBITRATOR MAY AWARD RELIEF ONLY IN FAVOR OF THE INDIVIDUAL PARTY SEEKING RELIEF AND ONLY TO THE EXTENT NECESSARY TO PROVIDE RELIEF WARRANTED BY THAT INDIVIDUAL PARTY'S CLAIM. The arbitrator is not authorized to award attorney's fees and costs or equitable relief. In the event the prohibition on class arbitration or any other provision in this arbitration agreement is deemed invalid or unenforceable, then the remaining provisions of these terms and conditions will remain in full force and effect. In the event of any dispute between the parties, you agree to first contact the Provider or AMCN and make a good faith effort to resolve the dispute before resorting to arbitration under these terms and conditions.







11. These terms and conditions supersede all previous terms and conditions between a member and the Providers or AMCN, including any other writings, or verbal representations, relating to the terms and conditions of membership. These terms and conditions may be modified or amended only in writing signed by the President or a Vice President of AMCN or a Provider, and may not be modified or amended orally, by trade usage or by course of conduct or dealing.

\*Air Evac EMS, Inc. / Guardian Flight, LLC / Med-Trans Corporation / REACH Air Medical Services, LLC -- These terms and conditions apply to all AMCN participating provider membership programs, regardless of which participating provider transports you.

# INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN SUTTON COUNTY AND THE CITY OF SONORA

This Interlocal Agreement (this "Agreement") is made between SUTTON COUNTY(the "COUNTY") and the CITY OF SONORA (the "CITY"), as of the Z8 day of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2025.

#### 1. RECITALS

Whereas, the COUNTY and the CITY are authorized to enter into an interlocal agreement pursuant to Section 791.001, Texas Government Code;

Whereas, the COUNTY and the CITY hold in trust certain properties that have passed through foreclosure for delinquent ad valorem taxes and did not sell at the courthouse:

Whereas, the COUNTY recognizes the community will be better served by assigning the County's rights to proceeds from re-sale of trust property within the city limits of the CITY to a fund to be used for maintenance, clean-up, safeguarding, demolition or disposal of said trust properties;

Whereas, the trust properties shall include and be limited to those trust properties within the City of Sonora jurisdictional lines;

Whereas, the proceeds from the re-sale of such properties would best allow the CITY to recover its costs associated with maintenance, clean-up, safeguarding, demolition or disposal of said trust properties and would benefit the County as a whole;

Whereas, the COUNTY and CITY agree that re-sale proceeds for the County will be held and managed by REBOOT TEXAS, a Texas 501(c)3, F/B/O THE CITY OF SONORA TRUST PROPERTY MAINTENANCE and Reboot Texas will be responsible for reporting to COUNTY quarterly or upon request, any and all re-sales and proceeds and any outlay of expenses for maintenance, clean-up, safe-guarding, demolition or disposal of trust properties within the City of Sonora. The funds can only be used funds for said trust properties, current or future, within the City of Sonora or for another purpose should the COUNTY and CITY agree to do so.

Whereas, the COUNTY retains its right of consent of all re-sales within the jurisdictional boundaries of the County using marketing services provided by TEXAS COMMUNITIES GROUP, LLC.

#### 2. AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the recitals, agreements and covenants set forth herein, the parties hereby agree that REBOOT TEXAS, a Texas 501(c)3, F/B/O THE CITY OF SONORA TRUST PROPERTY MAINTENANCE shall receive and maintain all of the County's proceeds from a resale of trust property within the CITY and its jurisdictional boundaries.

The COUNTY agrees that REBOOT TEXAS, a Texas 501(c)3 F/B/O THE CITY OF SONORA TRUST PROPERTY MAINTENANCE shall maintain and manage the re-sale proceeds in a designated fund for City of Sonora Trust Property Maintenance and be responsible for reporting to COUNTY, quarterly or as requested, any and all re-sale proceeds and any outlay of expenses for maintenance, clean up, safe-guarding, demolition or disposal of trust property within the CITY.

The COUNTY does not accept any responsibility or liability for the maintenance, clean-up, safe-guarding, demolition or disposal of any structure on said Trust Property.

The COUNTY shall retain the right of consent for all re-sales using the marketing services of TEXAS COMMUNITIES GROUP, LLC.

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with regards to the resale of trust property between the COUNTY and the CITY.

#### 3. TERMINATION

Either the COUNTY or the CITY may terminate this Agreement at its sole discretion with 30 days written notice to the other party.

#### 4. NOTICES

Any notice authorized or required to be given under this Agreement shall be delivered or sent to the following addresses:

#### 5. **GOVERNING LAW**

This Agreement shall be governed in all respects in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and shall be enforceable in Sutton County, Texas.

This Agreement is being executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original of which together shall constitute but one and the same instruments.

# BETWEEN TOM GREEN COUNTY AND SUTTON COUNTY FOR JAIL SERVICES

This Inter-local Agreement is entered into by and between TOM GREEN County, Texas, a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas, acting by and through its Commissioners Court, hereinafter referred to as "TOM GREEN," and SUTTON County, Texas, a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas, acting by and through its Commissioners Court, hereinafter referred to as "SUTTON."

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE, Chapter 791, authorized local governments of the state to enter into contracts for governmental functions and services to increase their efficiency and effectiveness; and

WHEREAS, such a consolidated effort for the housing and care of certain incarcerated inmates are in each party's best interest and that of the public and this agreement will increase the effective and efficient functioning of each party; and

WHEREAS, TOM GREEN and SUTTON are local governments as defined in the TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE, Section 791.003(4), have the authority to enter into this agreement, and have each entered into this agreement by the action of its governing body in the appropriate manner prescribed by law; and

WHEREAS, TOM GREEN and SUTTON specify that each party paying for the performance of said functions of government shall make those payments from current revenues available to the paying party;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, and of the terms, provisions, and mutual promises herein contained which fairly compensate the performing party, it is mutually agreed as follows:

## ARTICLE I TERM AND EFFECTIVE DATE

- 1. TERM: This Agreement shall be effective beginning October 1, 2025, and shall be effective through September 30, 2026.
- 2. RENEWAL: This Agreement shall automatically renew for additional one-year period on October 1<sup>st</sup> of each subsequent year with mutually agreed upon increases, unless this Agreement is terminated or notice of termination is given. TOM GREEN shall provide sixty (60) days' notice of any change to the per diem rate for detention services for subsequent terms.

#### 3. TERMINATION:

A. This Agreement may be terminated without cause at any time at the option of either **TOM GREEN or SUTTON** upon the giving of sixty (60) days written notice to the other party in the manner and form provided for herein.

The Notice is effective if sent by either the County Judge or the Sheriff. The termination of the Agreement will be effective upon the last day of the month in which the expiration of the sixty (60) day period occurs.

B. This Agreement is also subject to termination upon the occurrence of an event that renders performance hereunder by TOM GREEN impracticable or impossible, such as severe damage or destruction of TOM GREEN's facility or actions by governmental or judicial entities which create a legal barrier to the acceptance of any of SUTTON inmates.

## ARTICLE II DETENTION SERVICES

For the purposes and consideration herein stated and contemplated, TOM GREEN shall provide the following necessary and appropriate services for SUTTON to the maximum extent authorized by this Agreement, without regard to race, religion, color, age, sex, or national origin; to-wit:

- 1. PURPOSE: TOM GREEN shall provide housing and food to inmates presented by SUTTON who meet the following minimum criteria (as determined by the TOM GREEN County Sheriff or his designee):
  - A. Inmate must be at least 17 years of age;
  - B. Inmate must be of good general health; and
  - C. Inmate with serious institutional behavior history (as defined by the TOM GREEN disciplinary plan approved by the Texas Commission on Jail Standards) in the last 90 days may not be accepted.
- 2. HOUSING AND CARE OF INMATES: TOM GREEN will confine inmates and give them reasonable and humane care and treatment, consistent with the Texas Commission on Jail Standards and other express provisions in this Agreement. TOM GREEN will provide, as set out herein, for inmate's physical needs, retain them in safe custody, supervise them, maintain proper discipline and control, make certain inmates receive no privileges except those generally afforded other inmates and that the judgments and orders of the committing court and Board of Parole and Post- Prison Supervision are faithfully executed.
- 3. MEDICAL SERVICES: The per-day rate under this Agreement covers only routine medical services such as on-site sick call (when provided by TOM GREEN or contracted on-site staff) and non-non-prescription, over-the-counter/non-legend and routine drugs and medical supplies. The per-day rate does not cover medical health care services provided outside of TOM GREEN's facility or by anyone other than TOM GREEN facility staff, prescription drugs and treatment, or surgical, optical and dental care, and does not include the costs associated with the hospitalization of any inmate. SUTTON shall reimburse TOM GREEN the amount spent for medical services of all SUTTON inmates, other than routine medical services included in the per-day rate.

- 4. OFF-SITE SERVICES: SUTTON County Sheriff or designee shall be informed of any SUTTON inmates receiving emergency medical care, including but not limited to hospitalizations, that results in off-site services as soon as practicable after the service occurs (not more than 1 working day). TOM GREEN will assist SUTTON to monitor utilization of off-site services by providing information about the course of an inmate's care and treatment. SUTTON may elect to retake and return to SUTTON physical custody of an inmate to manage costs and utilization of services unless emergency care of the inmate is required.
- 5. OFF-SITE BILLING: This Agreement provides TOM GREEN with the authority to arrange for the off- site provider to bill SUTTON for the costs of hospitalization and/or medical care for any SUTTON inmate. In the event direct billing is unavailable SUTTON shall reimburse TOM GREEN in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 6. MEDICAL RECORDS: SUTTON agrees to provide TOM GREEN with a copy of each inmate's medical, dental and mental health record(s) for the purposes of continuity of care. TOM GREEN agrees to maintain a confidential record of the health care of each inmate. SUTTON shall ensure that these records are provided no less than 24 hours prior to the inmate's arrival at the TOM GREEN County Jail. A copy of each inmate's record shall be returned to SUTTON at the time each SUTTON inmate is returned.
- 7. MEDICAL INVOICES: SUTTON shall reimburse TOM GREEN monthly for health care services and associated expenses for which SUTTON is responsible under this section. TOM GREEN shall provide SUTTON with invoices for such costs and agrees not to add additional administrative charges for reimbursed costs.
- 8. INMATE MEDICAL REPORT: Upon request from SUTTON, TOM GREEN will provide an inmate's report of health care provided.
- 9. FACILITY INSPECTION: TOM GREEN agrees to allow periodic inspections of the facilities by SUTTON law enforcement personnel. The reports of state or federal inspections of the facilities will be provided to SUTTON upon request.
- 10. TRANSPORTATION AND OFF-SITE SECURITY: SUTTON is solely responsible for the transportation of inmates between the TOM GREEN County Jail and the SUTTON Facility. TOM GREEN agrees to provide ambulance and other transportation for SUTTON inmates to and from local off-site medical facilities and will invoice SUTTON in accordance with Article 2, Section 7.
- 11. COURT APPEARANCES: SUTTON shall be responsible for the transportation of SUTTON inmates to/from TOM GREEN County Jail. SUTTON will be responsible for the transportation of inmates for all court proceedings and hearings and during court appearances in SUTTON County.
- 12. TRANSPORTATION TO TDCJ: SUTTON is responsible for the transport of SUTTON inmates to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Institutional Division.
- 13. GUARD SERVICE: TOM GREEN will provide guard services as requested or required by the circumstances, or the law for inmates admitted or committed to an off-site medical facility at the rate of \$55 per hour/per guard (minimum 2 guards per transport). TOM GREEN shall provide SUTTON with invoices for such costs and agrees not to add additional administrative charges for reimbursed costs.

- 14. SPECIAL PROGRAMS: The per day rate set out in this Agreement covers basic custodial care and supervision and does not include special educational, vocational or other programs provided to inmates in TOM GREEN's facilities. The parties may contract by written agreement for the provision of special programs.
- 15. LOCATION AND OPERATION OF FACILITY: TOM GREEN shall provide the detention services described herein at the TOM GREEN County Jail located in San Angelo, Texas.
- 16. ADMITTING AND RELEASING: SUTTON shall provide inmate biographical information and charge information for each inmate no less than 24 hours prior to the inmate's arrival at the TOM GREEN County Jail. TOM GREEN shall be responsible for the admitting and releasing of inmates placed in TOM GREEN's facility. TOM GREEN will maintain records of all such transactions in a manner agreed upon by TOM GREEN and SUTTON, and provide such records to SUTTON upon request.
- 17. RETURN OF INMATES TO SUTTON: Upon demand by SUTTON, TOM GREEN will relinquish to SUTTON physical custody of any inmate. Upon request by TOM GREEN, SUTTON will resume custody of any inmate so requested within two (2) calendar days, or unless a different time is agreed upon by both parties.

### ARTICLE III FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

1. PER DIEM RATE: The per diem rate for detention services under this Agreement is eighty dollars (\$80.00) per man-day, subject to Article 1, Section 2 of this Agreement. This rate covers one inmate per day. A portion of any day will count as a man-day under this agreement.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, it is understood that SUTTON is paying for the performance of governmental functions or services must make those payments from current revenues available. In the event of a non-appropriation by SUTTON, TOM GREEN shall be relieved of its responsibilities hereunder as of the first day of the fiscal year of such non-appropriation. All payments must be in an amount that fairly compensates TOM GREEN for the services or functions performed under this agreement.

2. BILLING PROCEDURE: TOM GREEN shall submit an itemized invoice for the services provided each month to SUTTON. Such invoice will include a list of each of the inmates housed and the number of calendar days per inmate. Invoices will be submitted to the officer designated to receive the same on behalf of SUTTON. SUTTON will make payment to TOM GREEN within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of the invoice. Payment will be in the name of TOM GREEN County, Texas and will be remitted to:

### ARTICLE IV ACCEPTANCE OF INMATES

- 1. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW: TOM GREEN warrants that it will comply with all federal and state laws and with the requirements of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards while housing SUTTON inmates under this Agreement. Nothing herein will create any obligation upon TOM GREEN to house SUTTON inmates where the housing of said SUTTON inmates will, in the opinion of TOM GREEN Sheriff, raise the population of the facility above the permissible number of inmates allowed by law, or will, in the TOM GREEN County Sheriffs opinion, create a condition of overcrowding or create conditions which endanger the life and/or welfare of personnel and inmates at the facility, or result in possible violation of the constitutional rights of inmates housed at the facility. At any time that TOM GREEN Sheriff determines that a condition exists at TOM GREEN's facility necessitating the removal of SUTTON inmates, or any specified number thereof, SUTTON shall, upon notice by TOM GREEN Sheriff to SUTTON Sheriff, immediately remove said inmates from the facility. SUTTON will make every effort to remove any inmate within eight (8) hours of notice from TOM GREEN.
- 2. ELIGIBILITY FOR INCARCERATION AT THE FACILITY: SUTTON inmates incarcerated in this facility must meet the requirements of this Agreement and the State standards under both the Jail Commission-approved custody assessment system in place at the SUTTON jail and pursuant to the custody assessment system in place at TOM GREEN's facility. TOM GREEN reserves the right to review the inmate's classification/eligibility and the right to refuse to accept any inmate that it does not believe to be properly classified as a non-high-risk inmate. Furthermore, if an inmate's classification changes while incarcerated at TOM GREEN's facility, TOM GREEN reserves the right to demand that SUTTON remove that inmate and, if possible, replace said inmate with an appropriate inmate of SUTTON.
- 3. RESERVATION CONCERNING ACCEPTANCE OR CONTINUED INCARCERATION OF INDIVIDUAL INMATES: TOM GREEN reserves the right for its Sheriff or his designated representative to review the background of all inmates sought to be transferred to the TOM GREEN facility, and SUTTON shall cooperate with and provide information requested regarding any inmate by TOM GREEN Sheriff. TOM GREEN reserves the right to refuse acceptance of any inmate of SUTTON. Likewise, if any SUTTON inmate's behavior, medical or psychological condition, or other circumstance of reasonable concern to TOM GREEN Sheriff makes the inmate unacceptable for continued incarceration in TOM GREEN's facility in the opinion of TOM GREEN Sheriff, SUTTON will be requested to remove said inmate from TOM GREEN's facility, and will do so, if reasonably possible, within eight (8) hours upon the request of TOM GREEN Sheriff. Inmates may also be required to be removed from TOM GREEN's facility when their classification changes for any purpose, including long-term medical segregation.
- 4. INMATE SENTENCES: TOM GREEN will not be in charge or responsible for the computation or processing of inmates' time of confinement, including, but not limited to, computation of good time awards/credits and discharge dates. TOM GREEN will provide information that may be required regarding the inmates' behavior and performance; however, all such computations and record keeping will continue to be the responsibility of SUTTON. It will be the responsibility of SUTTON to notify TOM GREEN of any discharge date for an inmate at least two (2) calendar days before such date unless notification is not reasonably possible. TOM GREEN will release inmates of SUTTON only when such release is specifically requested in writing by the SUTTON Sheriff. However, it is agreed that the preferred and usual course of dealing between the parties shall be for TOM GREEN to return inmates to
- the SUTTON Jail shortly before the discharge date, and for SUTTON to discharge the inmate from the SUTTON Jail. SUTTON accepts all responsibility for the calculations and

determinations set forth above and for providing TOM GREEN notice of the same, and to the extent allowed by law, shall indemnify and hold harmless TOM GREEN from all liability or expenses of any kind arising therefrom. SUTTON is responsible for all paperwork and arrangements for inmates to be transferred to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Institutional Division.

5. BONDING/RELEASE: All inmates held for SUTTON will be required to bond in SUTTON County. SUTTON County will then send TOM GREEN a TTY stating that the inmate has been bonded, and SUTTON will transport back to their facility for release.

## ARTICLE Y MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. BINDING NATURE OF AGREEMENT: This Agreement is contractual and is binding upon the parties hereto and their successors, assigns and representatives.
- 2. NOTICE: All notices, demands, or other writings may be delivered by either party hereto to the other by United States Mail or other reliable courier at the following address:

The address to which any notice, demand, or other writing may be delivered to any party as above provided may be changed by written notice given by such party as above provided.

- 3. AMENDMENTS: This Agreement will not be modified or amended except by a written instrument executed by the duly authorized representatives of both parties and approved by the commissioner's courts of the respective parties hereto.
- 4. PRIOR AGREEMENTS: This Agreement contains all of the agreements and undertakings, either oral or written, of the parties with respect to any matter mentioned herein. No prior agreement or understanding pertaining to any such matter shall be effective.

- 5. REPRESENTATION: Each party understands and agrees that each party, its employees, servants, agents, and representatives shall at no time represent themselves to be employees, Servants, agents, and/or representative of the other party.
- 6. INDEPENDENT RELATIONSHIP: Each party shall have and retain the exclusive right of control over its employees and contractors assigned to perform services under this Agreement in accordance with the applicable laws of the State of Texas. Neither party has the authority to bind nor otherwise obligate the other orally, in writing or by any act or omission. Nothing contained herein shall establish an agency, employee-employer relationship, partnership, joint enterprise, joint employer, or joint venture relationship by or between the parties.
- 7. SEVERABILITY: If any provision of this agreement is found by a court of competent Jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement will not be affected, an in lieu of each provision which is found to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, there will be added as part of this Agreement a provision as similar to such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision as may be possible and be legal, valid, and enforceable.
- 8. LIABILITY: This agreement is made for the express purpose of providing detention services, which both parties recognize to be a governmental function. Except as hereinafter provided neither party assumes any liability beyond that required by law. Each party understands and agrees that it is responsible only for the acts, errors, or omissions of its employees and contractors. This Agreement in not intended to create any cause of action for the benefit of third parties.
- 9. APPROVALS: This Agreement must be approved by the governing bodies of both parties in accordance with the Texas Inter-Local Cooperation Act.

### **DECLARATION OF DISASTER**

WHEREAS, Sutton County on the 13 day of July, 2025, has suffered widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from severe flooding due to heavy rainfall, flash flooding, and river flooding;

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Sutton County has determined that it is necessary to renew the Declaration of Disaster set forth by the County Judge on July 13, 2025 due to extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF SUTTON COUNTY:

- 1. That a local state of disaster is hereby declared for pursuant to §418,108(a) of the Texas Government Code:
- Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the Sutton County Clerk;
- 3. Pursuant to §418.108(d) of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster continues the activation of the county emergency management plan.
- Pursuant to §262,024 of the Local Government Code, this declaration of local state of disaster, grants the exemption by Order of the Commissioners Court.
- 5. That this declaration shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
